

#### **BALLOT ISSUE 3K**

Without imposing any new tax or increasing the rate of any existing tax, may the City of Littleton retain and expend all revenue received by the city in 2022 from the sales and use tax approved by the city's registered electors on the passage of Ballot Issue 3A on November 2, 2021, and expend all taxes, grants and other revenues from such tax to be used for improvements such as neighborhood street and sidewalk maintenance and traffic solutions as was originally approved by voters and may the city continue to impose and collect the tax to the full extent of the rate permitted by the original voter approval?

#### **Summary of Written Comments For Issue: 3K**

In November 2021 Littleton voters approved ballot measure 3A, a 0.75% sales tax increase to be used for desperately needed road maintenance and backlogged capital projects. This measure was approved by 59% of Littleton voters. These funds have been instrumental in the unprecedented amount of work done in Littleton this past year including 25 miles of neighborhood street repair, replacement of deteriorating traffic signal poles at nine intersections, and three new raised crosswalks in the downtown area.

The revenue generated by this tax will be instrumental for the future of Littleton's infrastructure and transportation system. The City has approximately \$126 million of improvements for projects planned through 2030.

Upcoming projects include:

- Denver Water will be replacing a significant amount of water utility infrastructure in the downtown area. The tax revenues will fund a \$10,000,000 investment in the downtown area to include parking improvements, new landscaping (including replanted trees) and other features.
- The City has about \$30,000,000 of grant funding secured for transportation projects. These grants require a 20% match from the City, about \$6,000,000 is needed from the City to get \$36,000,000 of work done, all paid for by this tax revenue.
- The City is investing in upgrades to their IT system to protect against cyberattacks.
- Upgrades to the Belleview Service Center, which has several buildings that were built prior to 1950, will be made to provide needed updates to service facilities.
- Upgrades to the fleet of vehicles used to plow snow and repair our streets.
- Capital investment in our police department to include body cameras and other equipment.

So, why are we voting on this when voters already approved the funding and the work authorized is in progress?

## CITY OF LITTLETON

The State Constitution requires the City to ask the voters to keep unanticipated revenue when the revenue in the first full year exceeds the estimates made in advance of the original ballot question. Revenue estimates for the sales tax increase were made in the summer of 2021 when COVID-19 pandemic economic conditions weighed heavily on the City's economic forecast. Thankfully, our retail economy bounced back faster than expected, which generated approximately 10% more revenue than expected in 2022. These increased revenues can help offset the inflationary effects on project costs which have increased more than 10% from original projected amounts.

Measure 3K is simply the City's efforts to comply with State law. It is asking whether the City can keep the money already received and use it to keep doing the work the voters directed them to do with it in the first place. This is not a new tax or a tax increase. A vote of YES for Question 3K is a vote to continue investing in Littleton's future.

If this measure fails, the sales tax increase will be reduced from 0.75% to 0.33%, less than half of what voters originally approved. This 56% reduction in annual revenue would severely reduce the ability to fund future projects.

Vote YES on Question 3K.

### **Summary of Written Comments Against Issue: 3K**

Question 3K is a tax refund question.

If you want to keep your refund, then "VOTE NO" on Question 3K!

If you are like the vast majority of citizens and you cash the refund check or apply it to the following year's taxes, then "VOTE NO!"

Government always has worthy projects: for the children (LPS), for the parks (SSP&R), for the roads (2021), for arts and culture (lodging tax 2022) and to discourage marijuana use (scheduled 2024).

Economics is unlimited demands being placed on limited resources. Enough is enough. Most communities realize too late (California's doom loop), that they never asked "When is enough, enough?" Have we heard what is the optimum size of government? We have NOT heard what tax will be requested after 2024. We have NOT seen a graph of the last ten years of city population versus city employees versus taxes versus inflation versus monies spent on roads.

We need more transparency and certainty; we need to hear a better argument than just "for the roads." Use part of the \$60M reserve to cover this \$6M, and give us a total picture in 2025 to vote on!

Again, "VOTE NO" on 3K.

A philosophical aside:

Of course, we need taxes – the question is how much?

Taxes are to preserving a civilized society as is insulin to controlling diabetes. The question is to optimize the taxation rate so as not to overtax into a doom loop that some predict for California cities nor under tax to blow up into anarchy. Too many of us have lived sugar high lives and now thanks to modern medicine we can control it with insulin. Taxing entities do not have that immediate remediation feedback loop. TABOR is the concerned NAGGING SPOUSE, that keeps our municipalities fiscally healthy, none of us like it; but it works!

Again, "VOTE NO" on 3K.

## Summary of Written Comments FOR Ballot Issue No. 4A:

Yes on 4A-Believe in Englewood Schools

Englewood Schools offers a comprehensive education from preschool through Grade 12, serving approximately 2,500 students. Students in Englewood Schools attend one early childhood school, four elementary schools, two middle schools, and two high schools. Englewood Schools teachers and staff are hardworking and caring professionals who make it their mission to see every student succeed. However, the state of Colorado has long underfunded its schools. Schools have lost out on almost \$10 billion dollars over the last 13 years, which means a senior in high school today has never experienced a fully-funded public education.

Voting yes on 4A would ensure that Englewood Schools receive long term and continuous funding that could be used for operations, maintenance, and technology costs. In turn, this would free up funds for the district to invest in competitive salaries for our teachers and support staff including bus drivers, nutrition service staff, custodians, and para-professionals.

All of this is possible with no net increase to property taxes. This measure will increase the Debt-Free Schools Act by no more than 5 mills while Englewood Schools decreases the General Obligation Bond Mill Levy by the same amount, which means no net change in property taxes.

This measure will provide the district with a predictable, long-term source of revenue while maintaining tax neutrality for both Englewood home and business owners. These funds will be used for new and existing technology upgrades, as well as maintenance needs in school and operation costs. Thanks to our taxpayers, we have state of the art schools. Those buildings will require ongoing maintenance. By securing ongoing funds for these costs, general fund dollars from the school district would then be able to be spent on competitive salaries for teachers and staff, investing in top educational programs that fit the needs of our students, and empowering our students with the knowledge and skills needed to excel in the 21st-century job market.

We need to invest in our local schools to continue the legacy of excellence for generations to come. Quality schools increase our property values, which in turn protects our biggest financial investment - our homes. More than ever, we need to come together to support our kids, our schools, and our community.

## BENNETT SCHOOL DISTRICT 29J

### **Summary of Written Comments For Issue:**

Vote YES on Bennett Schools 5A

Bennett School District 29J needs to build a new high school to keep pace with the district's growing student population.

Overcrowding has become a significant issue at Bennett High School. There is not enough space in the high school for current student enrollment, and enrollment is expected to double over the next 5 years. The lack of classroom space limits class offerings and presents safety and security challenges. Investing in a new high school will ensure that future students and faculty have a safe environment that can accommodate educational opportunities like career and technical education. Current high school classrooms with 44 students are too crowded to allow proper instruction to occur.

The Board of Education recently forwarded a ballot question seeking voter approval to issue \$80 million in bonds to make critical investments for the school district, including:

- Constructing a new high school to address overcrowding due to enrollment increases;
- Enhancing career and technical educational opportunities for students; and
- Improving safety and security infrastructure at all district schools and addressing traffic and transportation issues.

A new high school will also allow the district to:

- Improve career and technical educational programs, allowing Bennett High students to graduate with job-ready skills. Colorado has a severe lack of skilled workers, and the state's construction industry needs an estimated 45,000 trained workers by 2027.
- Address traffic backups in the town of Bennett near the current high school.

Bennett School District will be updating current district facilities with new safety and security features. Some of these upgraded features may include but will not be limited to: lighting, parking lots, cameras and security systems, securing doors and hallways, etc. These safety measures will be determined by a committee of community members.

The district's bond proposal, if approved by voters, would only increase taxes by about \$6.38 per month on every \$100,000 of home value in the school district. This is great news! The district's assessed valuation went up over \$215 million in 2023, a 69% increase. Most of this increase was due to oil and gas production and means that most of the property taxes for the bond will be paid by oil and gas companies operating in the area. The second committee will be a financial oversight committee that will meet annually and review the financials from this project for compliance with the bond.

Finally, the school district has worked to be fiscally responsible with community tax dollars. Currently, the district has one of the lowest property tax rates of 23.501 mills, about half the property-tax rates of our neighboring districts. The district has not assessed bond mills in 3 years and has been 100% debt free since December 2022.

Please support the Bennett School District's bond proposal 5A. Doing so will allow the district to invest in the safety and education of future school students while keeping property taxes low for district residents. This proposal represents a solid, fiscally responsible investment in our community's future.

You can select a political party and will need to include your address.

Mail, Email or In-Person:

Complete the registration form and return it to our office via email- or print, fill it out and mail it in.

You may also schedule an appointment to register in-person at our office.

Remember to update your voter registration every time you move!

### Step 2: Receive Your Ballot

- Colorado is a mail ballot state. For each election you are eligible to vote in we will mail a ballot to the address we have on file.
- Ballots are mailed beginning 22 days before an election (early October for a November election).

### Step 3: Vote

Vote your mail ballot:

- Make your selections.

- You may also send your ballot back in the U.S. mail.
- Ballot must be received by 7 p.m. election day.

Postmarks do not count!

Vote in-person:

- If you need to vote in-person, you can visit any vote center in Arapahoe County to get the same ballot we would mail to you.
- Language assistance and accessible ballot marking devices for voters with disabilities are available at all voting centers.
- You must bring an acceptable ID to vote in-person.
- Vote centers are only open certain days and times in the final days leading into the election.
- Check [www.ArapahoeVotes.gov](http://www.ArapahoeVotes.gov) for vote center hours and drop box locations near you for each election.

Голосование лично:

- Если вам требуется помощь в личном голосовании, посетите любой избирательный участок в округе Агараное и возьмите там такой же бюллетень, который мы рассылает по почте.
- В избирательных участках доступны услуги переводчика и средства для простановки отметок в бюллетенях, предназначенные для помощи голосующим с ограничениями дееспособности.
